Cambridge to host EC celebration of Highland Gathering

SCOTTISH ancestors will be celebrated by men and girls in tartan skirts, bagpipes and quick steps and jumps, at Cambridge High next month.

The Eastern Cape Highland Gathering on September 3 from 8.30am to 5pm is expected to attract 1 000 South Africans with Scottish ancestry from around the country, said convener Dave Rankin.

Because the event takes place during heritage month, the hosts, the East London Caledonian Society, has invited anyone to join in.

"Although the main events are the Highland dancing and pipe band competitions, the gathering is also a wonderful opportunity for others to publicise their activities," Rankin said.

"Already, ninjas living in Cambridge West, who follow a strand of Japanese martial arts, will be attending."

Rankin said as many as 100 bagpipe players and dancers will perform.

Asked how many people with Scottish ancestry lived in the province he said: "Well, for starters anyone with 'Mac' in their

surname – but it runs to more than 20 000."

He said the 20 Caledonian societies in SA had, since being established in 1886, "never lost contact with Scotland", through

cultural links such as the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association.

The gathering committee invites anyone to erect a stall at a cost of R50. — mikel@dispatch.co.za
